Accordingly the committee recommends to the members that the amendments shown underlined and struck through in black below should be adopted (subject to two thirds of the members attending the AGM voting in favour of the proposal).

15. Winding Up

The Society may be dissolved by a two-thirds majority of members voting at an Annual General Meeting or Special General Meeting of the Society confirmed by a simple majority of members voting at a further Special General Meeting held not less than 14 days after the previous meeting. If a motion for the dissolution of the Society is to be proposed at an Annual General Meeting this motion shall be referred to specifically when notice of the meeting is given. In the event of the dissolution of the Society the available funds of the Society shall be transferred to such one or more charitable institutions having objects similar or reasonably similar to those herein before declared as shall be chosen by the Executive Committee and approved by the meeting of the Society at which the decision to dissolve the Society is confirmed. On dissolution (a) the Minute books and other records of the Society and (b) items of historic and public interest acquired by the Society shall be deposited with the Civic Trust Suffolk Public Record Office

If members are inclined to approve these amendments notice will be given to the Charity Commission of the change to the Constitution.
