I write to you in my capacity as chair of the Nayland Conservation Society. Although the property lies outside the parish of Nayland with Wissington many of our residents use the bridleway and we are all deeply alarmed at the destruction of the rural nature of a charming right of way. Accordingly I would be grateful if you would address the following points: -

- It is noted that the alignment width and condition of the public rights of way shall remain unaffected unless otherwise agreed in writing and that any damage resulting from works must be made good. The public right of way leading from the base of Gravel Hill has been substantially enlarged and a new hardcore base has been inserted upon the grass, destroying the rural appearance of the site. Please confirm whether permission has been granted for this action and if not whether enforcement action will be considered. If permission has been granted please explain how it is proposed to restore the footpath to its previous state and the time scale for such works.
- Please confirm if the applicant has shown legal rights of vehicular access over the bridle path. If no such rights exist please confirm what action will be taken to prohibit the current movement of vehicles over the bridle path? I await your response,
